## February Meeting

**Tuesday, February 16, 2010**  
**"Phillis Wheatly: The Female Slave-Poet and the Quest for Humanity"**  
*Presented by Kimberly Flint-Hamilton*

The speaker for the February MOAS Guild meeting, Kimberly Flint-Hamilton, Ph.D., is Associate Professor of Sociology & Anthropology, and Chair of the Department at Stetson University in Deland.

Dr. Flint-Hamilton received her B.A. Degree from the University of Notre Dame with a double major in Biological Sciences and Classical Studies. After a series of assignments which included being a regular member of the American School of Classical studies at Athens, Greece she earned a Ph.D. in Classical Studies from Duke University.

Thereafter, she returned to the University of Norte Dame, where her assignments included being Assistant Professor of Classical Studies, Assistant Professor of History, Assistant Dean of the College of Arts and Letters, as well as Director of the African & African-American Studies Program.

Dr. Flint-Hamilton has been a member of the faculty at Stetson University since August of 1999 and was granted tenure and promoted from Assistant Professor to Associate Professor of Anthropology in May of 2003. She has been Chair of the Department of Sociology and Anthropology since August of 2007.

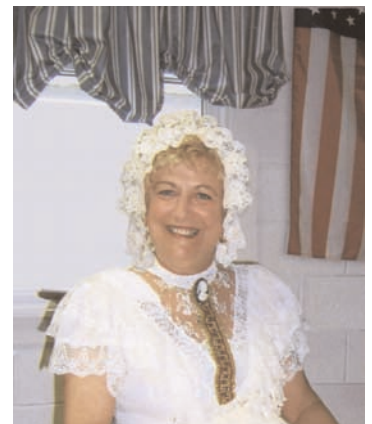

### STEPS IN MAKING A MOTION

**1)** Rise and address the chair, "Madam President." **2)** The presiding officer assigns you the floor by stating your name or by nodding at you. **3)** State the motion: "I move to, or I move that. . ." then be seated. **4)** It needs a second. **5)** The presiding officer repeats the motion and places it before the assembly by stating: "It is moved and seconded that. . . Is there any discussion?" **6)** Members discuss the motion by rising, addressing the chair, and being assigned the floor. **7)** The presiding officer takes a vote by stating, "All those in favor say 'Aye.' Those opposed say 'No.'" **8)** The presiding officer announces the vote and whether the motion is adopted or defeated saying, "The ayes have it," and the motion is carried; or, "The noes have it," and the motion is lost.
