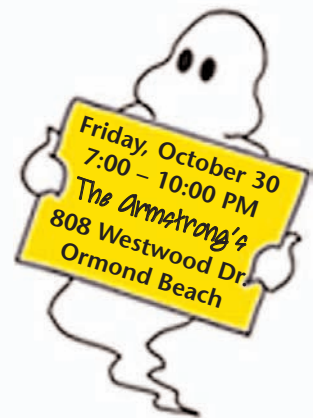

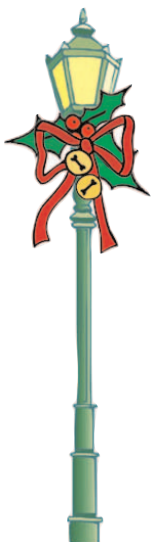

Buy a tree and gift it to a charity (we will have a list of local charities). We will put your name and the name of the charity on your tree. Become a re-gifter!

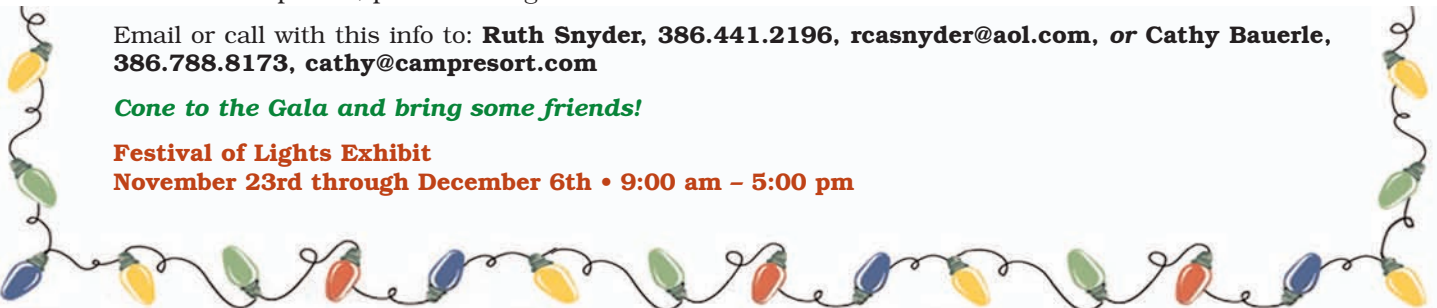

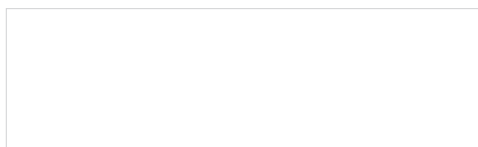
