At the March 3rd Guild Board meeting, a comprehensive email policy was adopted to reflect and comply with standards created by the computer industry for best business practices. New technology brings new challenges and the best interests of our membership is paramount. Here are the main points of our new policy (paraphrased).



1. Policy for Quick Relay of Information

For use especially when there is no time for regular announcements that are usually made through Musings or General Meetings

- Email for those who have provided an email address during application or renewal process
- Utilization of the Telephone Committee for those who do not have email capability

2. The Use of Bulk/Mass Emails

- Emergency notification (Ex: Museum closing)
- Last minute meetings
- Promote events that are not filling up
- Only use Bcc (blind copy—email addresses not visible to others) to protect the privacy of members
- Congratulatory messages should be left to the Musings, unless the same messages are sent via postal service to those without email.

The email addresses of our members are private and not to be used for any purpose other than Guild business or personal correspondence—unless a member specifically has stated a desire to receive another organization's or business information.

Duties of the Members (Part 2)
