The Parliamentarian



Here is how justice, impartiality, and equality operate in meetings:

- The presiding officer doesn't take sides but allows all to be heard equally in debate. If the presiding officer wants to voice an opinion, the presiding officer relinquishes the chair to another officer so that he or she can speak and vote.
- The presiding officer ensures that all sides of an issue are heard and that the rules of debate are carefully followed. This prevents a small group from railroading a motion through.
- Members have the right to make a motion to take a vote by ballot during a controversial issue.
- Members have the right to a trial when they're accused of wrongdoing.
- All members have the right to have notice of all meetings. The organization can give notice by mail, phone, electronic communication, or an announcement at a previous meeting.
